STANDARD INITIAL TREATMENT OF A COLD

TO BE USED AT THE FIRST SIGNS OF A URI

- 1. Continue your anti-histamine daily.
- 2. Stop already prescribed nasal sprays for three days; then resume nasal spray.
- 3. Use Neo-synephrine Nasal Spray ¼%, two sprays each nostril 3 x daily for three days. Then Stop. (should be purchased in the office for \$5).
- 4. Use plain Robitussin two tsp.3 x day for three days. Plain Mucinex may be substituted, I tablet 2 x daily for 3 days.
- 5. Use steam inhalation multiple times daily for three days.
- 6. Drink 2 quarts of fluid daily; avoid alcohol.
- 7. Get some rest
- 8. Avoid all strenuous exercise at least one week.
- 9. Do not use over-the-counter cold or flu medications.
- 10.If discolored mucus develops, call this office or family doctor.
- 11.Azithromycin (ZITHROMAX) (Z-PAC) DOES NOT WORK FOR RESPIRATORY TRACT ILLNESS. Do not accept it if you seek my care for this episode.
- 12.Continue to use all other prescribed medications, especially anti-asthmatic medications, sprays and nebulizer treatments
- 13. Steroid nasal and oral inhalers may be prescribed
- 14.Flu shots are to be received each year, by mid October, and Pneumovax or Prevnar vaccine should be received every 6 years. THIS APPLIES TO EVERYONE.

REMEMBER: WE PREFER TO HANDLE MINOR PROBLEM, IN TIMELY FASHION, RATHER THAN HAVING TO PLAY "CATCH-UP" OR HOSPITALIZING PATIENTS.

CHILDREN: Instructions are similar, but dosage may have to be changed. Especially important in children is adequate hydration. Call this office or pediatrician promptly.
